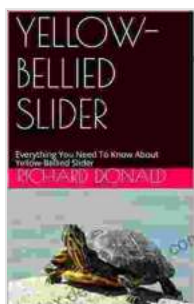


Everything You Need to Know About Yellow-Bellied Sliders

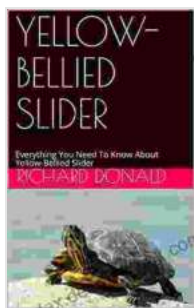

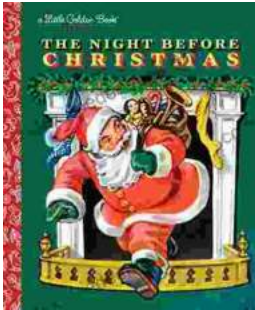

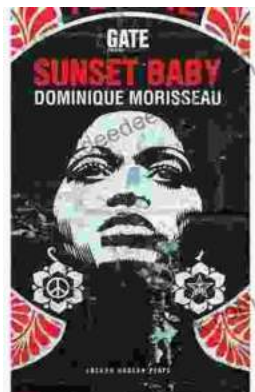
