

Floaters or dark spots in the field of vision.

General vision issues and concerns.

◆ Common Treatments

Corticosteroid eye drops.

Injections in or around the eye.

Immunosuppressive drugs.

Immunosuppressive agents.

Surgical intervention.

Uveitis is a group of eye conditions that cause inflammation of the uvea, the middle layer of the eye. The uvea is made up of the iris, the ciliary body, and the choroid. Uveitis can be caused by a variety of factors, including infection, injury, and autoimmune disorders.

Symptoms of Uveitis

The symptoms of uveitis can vary depending on the type of uveitis and the severity of the inflammation. Some of the most common symptoms include:

- Help with vision problems



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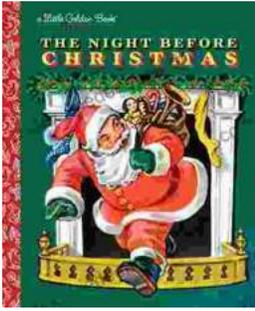
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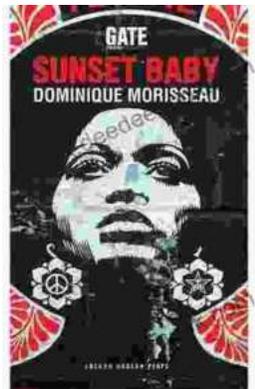
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
